# **MISSIONARY DISCIPLESHIP**

Accessibility to Unchurched, Non-Catholics and Non-Practicing Catholics: The Sunday Mass is the core gathering and central to the life of the parish, however the Mass is not aimed at being an entry point for people new or distant from faith. For some people it has been their conversion point, walking in off the street and discovering something completely different and (hopefully) awe inspiring. However, for most people we may know who are not practicing Catholics, the Mass might not be the best place for them as their first contact with parishes. Are there other, regular celebrations, services or events that could be an easier way in for people? This could be social events where the work of the parish is shared through testimony or celebration. Services of the Word which are open to discussion, sharing and personal testimony. Or even social action that contains times of prayer and emphasising the 'why' we do what we do not just the 'what' we do.
